Radical Inclusion

The Acts of the Apostles is the story of the early church's radical inclusion. Bearing witness to Jesus stepping over boundaries including the boundary of death, empowers this early community of faith to become radically inclusive of people of differing ethnicities, races, cultures, sexual identities, names, and families. In the Acts of the Apostles, we can see the excitement and the resistance to such inclusion.



The dynamic of inclusion, of stepping over boundaries and barriers, continues to this day with the church's inclusion of Christians with differing sexual orientations, abilities, races, cultures, immigration statuses, economic means and, yes, political affiliations. It is out of such a holy mess that the new creation we are called to be emerges.

Ethiopia serving the Ethiopian Queen (Acts 8:26-40).



What to Expect When We Worship at First Parish on May 23

Love of God

Thanksgiving and praise will rise to heaven as we begin coming out from the Covid-19 pandemic. It will be a joyous time to be with one another and to worship God together.



Love of Neighbor

One of the practices of our faith is loving our neighbor. Prioritizing the life and health of our neighbors during this next phase of the Covid pandemic means we will:

1. Wear masks.

Wear your Sunday best. If you forget, we will also have masks for you as you enter.

2. Stay physically distanced.

Yes, St. Paul said, "... greet one another with a holy kiss"... but not yet! As vaccines for children are not anticipated until 2022 handshakes, hugs, and kisses will need to wait. We will also need to space ourselves in the pews.

3. Be well.

When we are not well, we should love our neighbors and stay home.

4. Wash hands.

Handwashing combined with socially distancing and wearing masks has pushed the rate of



flu infections and the common cold to unheard of lows this year. It is simple and effective.

5. Worship outdoors or in a ventilated space.

Covid-19 is most infectious in enclosed spaces over a long time. Fortunately, we have a Meeting House with two stories of windows that can be opened and a lovely patio.

6. Socialize outside.

Increasingly we are learning that transmission of the virus is minuscule when outside and distanced. So, catch up with friends and family outside on the patio, the lawn, or a walkway.

7. Shorten worship.

We will be minimizing risk and possible exposure over time by shortening our worship.

8. Limit singing.

Due to the respiratory nature of the virus, congregational singing will be postponed.

9. Family friendly and inter-generational.

Worship will be designed to be family friendly. With physical distancing, families are encouraged to sit together. Initially we will not have a staffed nursery though it will be open for parents to use as needed.

10. Be vaccinated.

If you have not yet been vaccinated and need assistance signing up or finding a vaccination site, please speak with our Faith Community Nurse, Marge Eramo.

11. Be flexible.

Covid-19 has been a surprising virus. We have learned much since the early days of wiping down groceries so our practices to promote safety and minimize risk will change over time. As the rates of vaccinations increase and of infections decreases, we will gratefully continue to adapt!
