We are excited to see you in-person this Sunday! Here is the schedule for our re-opening worship:

Pre-worship -- Roger Christian will be outdoors near the side entrance to take your name and offer you a mask if you need one. We will enter via the front entrance to avoid asking people to wait indoors in the side entry area. Those who need to use the elevator may enter via the side entrance.



Children -- are welcomed and encouraged to attend with their families, there will be worship bags prepared especially for them, a children's message in worship and a patio activity following the service.

In Worship -- We will begin this Sunday to find our way back to worship as we remember it. We will enjoy many elements of worship -- the liturgy, the Word for All Ages, the Sermon, the Offering, service music. We still await the day when we will be able to read

responsively and sing hymns safely or greet each other with the "Peace of Christ." But those days are surely coming. Please note that the choir will be singing during worship on Sunday.

Name tags -- Please wear your name tag! We have not yet met some of you in person and will struggle to recognize you behind your masks. We want to be able to greet you by name! Name tags will be available where Roger Christian will be signing you in.

Memorial Service for Shirley DeFeo Saturday, May 22 @ 11am

There will be a Memorial Service for Shirley DeFeo (November 3, 1927 – March 11, 2021) at 11am on Saturday, May 22.

In addition to our guidelines for *Life Together* ... in a *Time of Covid* published below in this e-news, we will be abiding by the state guidelines which limits the number of people that can be in an indoor room together. Once the family is seated, we may only be able to seat another 35 persons. If you are planning to attend, please email Richard Edens, jrichardedens@gmail.com, so we can then add names of people from the church to be seated to the names of those from the family. People who are on the family list will be seated first, those who have registered with First Parish will be seated next. Those who come who are not on either list will be seated if there is availability.

We are making plans to livestream the service over Facebook so it should be possible to see the service in other rooms in the church or on the patio or on your cellphone. More information to follow.

Life Together...in a Time of Covid

As we begin meeting again for worship these are guidelines for our *Life Together* ... in a Time of Covid Our sanctuary's capacity is approximately 60 persons according to the current Massachusetts regulations for indoor space. This number will change in July or August as the vaccination rate continues to increase and the rate of infection continues to decrease.

1. Sign in as you enter

There will be a table for you to sign in with your name and phone number or email address should we need to "contact trace."

2. Wear masks.

Wear your Sunday best. If you forget, we will also have masks for you as you enter.

3. Stay physically distanced.

Yes, St. Paul said, "... greet one another with a holy kiss"... but not yet! As vaccines for children are not anticipated until 2022 handshakes, hugs, and kisses will need to wait. We will also need to space ourselves in the pews.

4. Be well.

When we are not well, we should love our neighbors and stay home.

5. Wash hands.

Handwashing combined with socially distancing and wearing masks has pushed the rate of flu infections and the common cold to unheard of lows this year.

6. Worship outdoors or in a ventilated space.

Covid-19 is most infectious in enclosed spaces over a long time. Fortunately, we have a Meeting House with two stories of windows and a lovely patio.

7. Socialize outside.

Increasingly we are learning that transmission of the virus is minuscule when outside and distanced. So, catch up with friends and family outside on the patio, the lawn, or a walkway.

8. Shorten worship.

We will be minimizing risk and possible exposure over time by shortening our worship.

9. Limit singing.

Due to the respiratory nature of the virus, congregational singing will be postponed.

10. Family friendly and inter-generational.

Worship will be designed to be family friendly. With physical distancing, families are encouraged to sit together. Initially we will not have a staffed nursery though it will be open for parents to use as needed.

11. Be vaccinated.

If you have not yet been vaccinated and need assistance signing up or finding a vaccination site, please speak with our Faith Community Nurse, Marge Eramo.

12. Be flexible.

Covid-19 has been a surprising virus. We have learned much since the early days of wiping down groceries so our practices to promote safety and minimize risk will change over time. As the rates of vaccinations increase and of infections decreases, we will gratefully continue to adapt!


Seeking Volunteers to Lead Worship this Summer
